

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following E-911 ordinance.

**TOWN OF HARTLAND  
E-911 ORDINANCE**

**SECTION 1 PURPOSE**

THE PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE IS TO ENHANCE THE RAPID LOCATION OF PROPERTIES BY FIRE, LAW ENFORCEMENT, RESCUE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL IN THE TOWN OF HARTLAND, MAINE.

**SECTION 2 AUTHORITY**

THIS ORDINANCE IS ADOPTED PURSUANT TO AND CONSISTENT WITH THE MUNICIPAL HOME RULE POWERS AS PROVIDED FOR IN ARTICLE VIII, PART 2, SECTION 1 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF MAINE AND TITLE 30-AM.R.S.A. SECTION 3001.

**SECTION 3 ADMINISTRATION**

THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE ADMINISTERED BY THE ADDRESSING COMMITTEE, WHICH IS AUTHORIZED TO AND SHALL ASSIGN ROAD NAMES AND NUMBERS TO ALL PROPERTIES BOTH ON EXISTING AND PROPOSED ROADS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CRITERIA IN SECTIONS 4 AND 5. THE ADDRESSING COMMITTEE SHALL ALSO BE RESPONSIBLE TO MAINTAINING THE FOLLOWING OFFICIAL RECORDS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

1. A HARTLAND MAP FOR OFFICIAL USE SHOWING ROAD NAMES AND NUMBERS.
2. AN ALPHABETICAL LIST OF ALL PROPERTY OWNERS AS IDENTIFIED BY CURRENT ASSESSMENT RECORDS, BY LAST NAME, SHOWING THE ASSIGNED NUMBERS.
3. AN ALPHABETICAL LIST OF ALL ROADS WITH PROPERTY OWNERS LISTED IN ORDER OF THEIR ASSIGNED NUMBERS.

**SECTION 4 NAMING SYSTEM**

ALL ROADS THAT SERVE TWO OR MORE PROPERTIES SHALL BE NAMED REGARDLESS OF WHETHER OWNERSHIP IS PUBLIC OR PRIVATE. "ROAD" REFERS TO ANY HIGHWAY, ROAD, STREET, AVENUE, LANE, PRIVATE WAY, OR SIMILAR PAVED, UNPAVED OR DIRT THOROUGHFARE. "PROPERTY" REFERS TO ANY PROPERTY ON WHICH A MORE OR LESS PERMANENT STRUCTURE HAS BEEN ERECTED OR COULD BE PLACED. ROAD NAME ASSIGNED BY THE TOWN OF HARTLAND SHALL NOT CONSTITUTE OR IMPLY ACCEPTANCE OF THE ROAD AS A PUBLIC WAY.

- a. NO TWO ROADS SHALL BE GIVEN THE SAME NAME.
- b. NO TWO ROADS SHOULD HAVE SIMILAR SOUNDING NAMES.
- c. EACH ROAD SHALL HAVE THE SAME NAME THROUGHOUT ITS ENTIRE LENGTH.

**SECTION 5 NUMBERING SYSTEM**

NUMBERS SHALL BE ASSIGNED EVERY 50 (FIFTY) FEET ALONG BOTH SIDES OF THE ROAD, WITH EVEN NUMBERS APPEARING ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE ROAD, AND ODD NUMBERS APPEARING ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE ROAD, DETERMINED BY THE NUMBER ORIGIN.

- a. ALL NUMBER ORIGINS SHALL BEGIN FROM THE DESIGNATED CENTER OF HARTLAND FOR DEAD END ROADS, NUMBERING SHALL ORIGINATE AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE ADJACENT ROAD AND TERMINATE AT THE DEAD END.
- b. THE NUMBER ASSIGNED TO EACH STRUCTURE SHALL BE THAT OF THE NUMBERED INTERVAL FALLING CLOSEST TO THE FRONT DOOR. IF THE FRONT DOOR CANNOT BE SEEN FROM THE MAIN ROAD, THE NUMBER SHALL BE THAT OF THE INTERVAL FALLING CLOSEST TO THE DRIVEWAY OF THE SAID STRUCTURE.
- c. EVERY STRUCTURE WILL BE THAN ON PRINCIPLE USE OR OCCUPANCY SHALL HAVE A SEPARATE NUMBER FOR EACH USE OR OCCUPANCY.

**SECTION 6 COMPLIANCE**

ALL OWNERS OF STRUCTURES SHALL DISPLAY AND MAINTAIN IN A CONSPICUOUS PLACE ON SAID STRUCTURE, THE ASSIGNED NUMBERS IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER.

- a. NUMBER ON THE STRUCTURE OR RESIDENCE WHERE THE RESIDENCE OR STRUCTURE IS WITHIN 50 (FIFTY) FEET OF THE EDGE OF THE ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY. THE ASSIGNED NUMBER SHALL BE DISPLAYED ON THE FRONT OF THE RESIDENCE OR STRUCTURE OR THE FRONT DOOR OR ENTRY. IT SHALL BE OF A REFLECTIVE NATURE AND A SIZE OF

- b. NUMBER AT THE STREET LINE. WHERE THE RESIDENCE OR STRUCTURE IS OVER 50 (FIFTY) FEET FROM THE EDGE OF THE ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY, THE ASSIGNED NUMBER SHALL BE DISPLAYED ON A POST, FENCE, WALL, MAIL BOX, OR ON SOME STRUCTURE AT THE PROPERTY LINE NEXT TO THE WALK OR ACCESS DRIVE TO THE RESIDENCE OR STRUCTURE.
- c. SIZE AND COLOR OF NUMBER. NUMBERS SHALL BE DISPLAYED IN A COLOR AND SIZE APPROVED FOR USE BY THE ADDRESSING COMMITTEE AND SHALL BE LOCATED TO BE VISIBLE FROM THE ROAD.
- d. DIFFERENT NUMBERS. EVERY PERSON WHOSE DUTY IT IS TO DISPLAY THE ASSIGNED NUMBERS SHALL REMOVE ANY DIFFERENT NUMBERS THAT MIGHT BE MISTAKEN FOR, OR CONFUSED WITH THE NUMBER ASSIGNED IN CONFORMANCE WITH THIS ORDINANCE.
- e. INTERIOR LOCATION. ALL RESIDENTS AND OTHER OCCUPANTS ARE REQUESTED TO POST THE ASSIGNED NUMBER AND ROAD NAME NEXT TO THEIR TELEPHONE FOR EMERGENCY REFERENCE.

**SECTION 7 NEW CONSTRUCTION AND SUBDIVISIONS**

ALL NEW CONSTRUCTION AND SUBDIVISIONS SHALL BE NAMED AND NUMBERED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE AND AS FOLLOWS.

- a. NEW CONSTRUCTION. WHENEVER ANY RESIDENCE OR OTHER STRUCTURE IS CONSTRUCTED OR DEVELOPED, IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE NEW OWNER TO OBTAIN AN ASSIGNED NUMBER FROM THE PLANNING BOARD. THIS SHALL BE DONE AT THE TIME OF ISSUANCE OF THE BUILDING PERMIT.
- b. NEW SUBDIVISIONS. ANY PROSPECTIVE SUBDIVIDER SHALL SHOW A PROPOSED ROAD NAME AND LOT NUMBERING SYSTEM OF THE PRE-APPLICATION SUBMISSION TO THE PLANNING BOARD. APPROVAL BY THE PLANNING BOARD SHALL CONSTITUTE THE ASSIGNMENT OF ROAD NAMES AND NUMBERS TO THE LOTS IN THE SUBDIVISION. ON THE FINAL PLAN SHOWING PROPOSED ROADS, THE APPLICANT SHALL MARK ON THE PLAN, LINES OR DOTS IN THE CENTER OF THE STREETS EVERY 50 (FIFTY) FEET TO AID IN ASSIGNMENT OF NUMBERS TO STRUCTURES SUBSEQUENTLY CONSTRUCTED.

**SECTION 8 EFFECTIVE DATE**

THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE AS OF March 2, 1997. IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE ADDRESSING COMMITTEE TO NOTIFY BY MAIL EACH PROPERTY OWNER AT LEAST 30 (THIRTY) DAYS BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF ITS USE. IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF EACH PROPERTY OWNER TO COMPLY WITH THIS ORDINANCE, INCLUDING THE POSTING OF NEW PROPERTY NUMBERS, WITHIN 30 (THIRTY) DAYS FOLLOWING NOTIFICATION. ON NEW STRUCTURES, NUMBERING WILL BE INSTALLED BEFORE FINAL INSPECTION OR WHEN THE STRUCTURE IS FIRST USED OR OCCUPIED, WHICHEVER COMES FIRST.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$12000 for the purpose of a revaluation upgrade of the community.


- Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2200 for Summer Baseball.

- Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to turn over monies received from the Treasurer of State on snowmobile registrations for 1997 to Smokey's Angels Snowmobile Club for maintenance of snowmobile trails for the benefit and use by all public.
- Budget Committee Recommends: YES
- Article 33. To see when the Town will vote to have taxes committed, when they will be payable and what rate of interest will be charged.
- June 1 Real Estate, September 1 interest if unpaid by September 1 at 10.5%
- Budget Committee Recommends: YES
- Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to accept all State monies received by the Town during State Fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997.

Local Road Assistance  
State Aid to Education (including Federal pass-through funds and property tax relief)  
Public Library State Aid per Capita  
Civil Emergency Funds (Emergency Management Assistance)  
Snowmobile Registration money  
Tree Growth Re-imbusement  
Veterans Exemption Re-imbusement  
State Grants or Other Funds (this category includes all funds received from the State that are not included in items above.)
- Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to use a carried balance of \$2500 for the Hepatitis B program.
- Budget Committee Recommends: YES
- Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to accept any and all materials and supplies donated for Town use.
- Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to take \$52000 from excise taxes, \$34000 from Local Road Assistance for the Town Road Account, and sidewalks.
- Budget Committee Recommends: YES
- Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1500 for Office Equipment.
- Budget Committee Recommends: YES
- Article 39. To see if the Town will vote to have a 12 citizen committee appointed to cooperate with the Selectmen in preparing a recommended budget for the next annual meeting. One being designated as Chairman of the Committee.


